

Poland Niemza

Niemcza is a historic town located in Dzierżoniów County, Lower Silesian Voivodeship, in southwestern Poland. Situated on the Ślęza River within the scenic Niemcza-Strzelin Hills, this small town has a population of just under 5,000 residents and is renowned for its rich medieval architecture and century-long defense history.

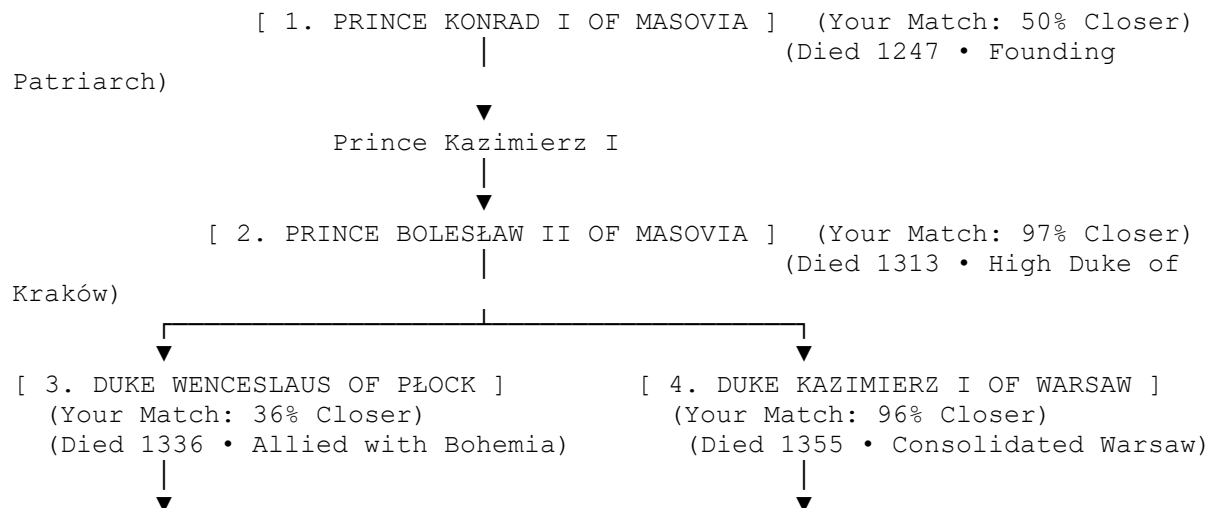

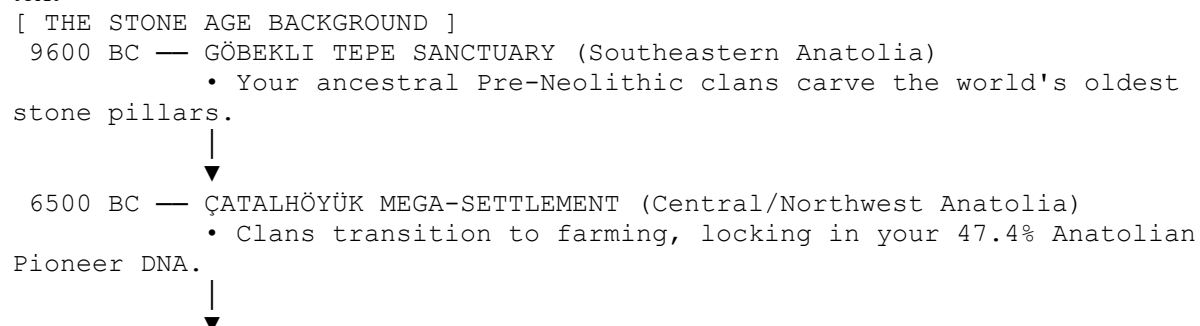
